Jeanne Sorg will come to the main library in Blue Bell on May 30 at 11am to discuss FraudSleuth a free service from the Montgomery County Recorder of Deeds for homeowners, that alerts them via email if anything is ever recorded in their office against their property. On August 22, 6:00 pm Recorder Sorg will provide an over-

-view of the types of documents recorded with their office. She will demonstrate how to search the online database for current and historical deeds for properties in Montgomery Historical documents can reveal valuable information about family relationship and property history, making this a presentation not to be missed.

Main Library Renovation Update

In this momentous year of the Wissahickon Valley Public Library's 100th Anniversary, we would like to thank everyone who donated to help the library find the funds to renovate. Because of your donations and a matching Keystone Grant (from the Office of Commonwealth Libraries, Department of Education, with funds provided from the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund) the roof renovation is now complete. During this process, we want to get your feedback. We will be speaking with library users to find out what it is you want the library to provide for you. So far, from our recent accessibility survey, we found that people really needed a third place, after home and work or school and home. We learned that people wanted a place to meet friends for games, a more comfortable place to study, a quieter place to read and work. Based on this knowledge, the library plans to add more study rooms and a multi-purpose space for patrons to use. The library is currently applying for grants to continue the work. We need to repave the parking lot, but we have to wait until we are sure we have no plumbing issues. Then we can renovate the bathrooms. After that, we can build the new study rooms, upgrade the flooring, replace furniture and paint. On the outside, we want to create a welcoming facade that is inviting and warm. How can you help? While we are working hard at getting grants, we still need funding to complete the project. Won't you help us create a safe and attractive environment for children to play and learn, a place where students and adults feel comfortable reading and studying, a modern building where families can enjoy spending time together with their kids and a welcoming space where adults and seniors can socialize and learn new things?


